



La Niña that started during the second half of 2020 has ended. El Niño Southern Oscillation (ENSO)-neutral conditions are now present across most of the tropical Pacific Ocean. Most of the climate models predict ENSO-neutral state likely to continue through June-July-August 2021 season.

## WEATHER SYSTEMS THAT AFFECTED THE COUNTRY

LOW PRESSURE AREA (LPA) Areas of lowest pressure characterized by cloudiness and rainshowers; areas where a tropical cyclone can form

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EASTERLIES Warm winds blowing from the east that may bring cloudiness over the eastern part of the country

## ((( H RIDGE OF HIGH PRESSURE AREA (HPA)

An extension of a high pressure area characterized by very light wind and clear skies

### INTERTROPICAL CONVERGENCE ZONE (ITCZ)

Series of low pressure areas brought about by converging northeast (NE) and southeast (SE) winds that cause thunderstorms and rainshowers

### LOCALIZED THUNDERSTORM

Isolated heavy and dense dark clouds with one or more sudden electric discharges manifested by lightning and thunder often accompanied by showers of rain.



## **TEMPERATURE**

Generally, near to warmer than average surface temperatures were observed in most parts of Luzon, while near to slightly cooler than average surface temperatures were felt over most areas in Visavas and Mindanao.

Lowlands Luzon 20.4°C - 41.6°C

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Metro Manila 21.7°C to 35.1°C

Visayas 22.6°C – 35.0°C Mountainous Mindanao 16.7°C – 33.3°C

Lowlands Mindanao 21.2°C – 36.8°C

## EXPECTED WEATHER SYSTEMS

### EASTERLIES

Warm winds blowing from the east that may bring cloudiness over the eastern part of the country

### LOW PRESSURE AREA (LPA)

Areas of lowest pressure characterized by cloudiness and rainshowers; areas where a tropical cyclone can form

### SOUTHWEST MONSOON (HABAGAT)

Warm moist winds from the southwest causing rains over the western portion of the country from May to September
