Storm Surge Warning #10 FINAL

Storm surge heights have reached to insignificant level due to Typhoon Kiko's areas of maximum winds are now offshore. Latest model results show no more serious threat for storm surge. However, wind driven waves may still affect low-lying coastal communities.

Recommended Action

The public is still advised to continue monitor for weather and storm surge updates from PAGASA particularly those provinces with **Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals** (TCWS).

Residents living in the low-lying coastal communities are still advised to stay away from the coast or beaches and cancel marine activites until all TCWS have lifted up.
