



WEATHER ADVISORY NO. 2

FOR: **LOW PRESSURE AREA**
ISSUED AT: **11:00 PM, 12 MAY 2021**

AT **10:00 PM** TODAY, THE **LOW PRESSURE AREA** WAS ESTIMATED BASED ON ALL AVAILABLE DATA AT **485 KM EAST OF DAVAO CITY (6.9°N, 130.2°E)**. THIS WEATHER DISTURBANCE **MAY DEVELOP INTO A TROPICAL DEPRESSION** WITH THE DOMESTIC NAME "CRISING" **IN THE NEXT 24 HOURS**. MOVING GENERALLY WESTWARD TO WEST NORTHWESTWARD, IT IS ALSO FORECAST TO MOVE ONSHORE OVER THE EASTERN COAST OF MINDANAO TOMORROW EVENING OR FRIDAY EARLY MORNING.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

HEAVY RAINS: BETWEEN TOMORROW (13 MAY) MORNING AND FRIDAY (14 MAY) MORNING, THIS DISTURBANCE MAY BRING MODERATE TO HEAVY RAINS OVER SURIGAO DEL SUR, DAVAO ORIENTAL, AND DAVAO DE ORO. UNDER THESE CONDITIONS, ISOLATED TO SCATTERED FLOODING (INCLUDING FLASH FLOODS) AND RAIN-INDUCED LANDSLIDES ARE POSSIBLE DURING HEAVY OR PROLONGED RAINFALL ESPECIALLY IN AREAS THAT ARE HIGHLY OR VERY HIGHLY SUSCEPTIBLE TO THESE HAZARDS AS IDENTIFIED IN HAZARD MAPS. ADJACENT OR NEARBY AREAS MAY ALSO EXPERIENCE FLOODING IN THE ABSENCE OF SUCH RAINFALL OCCURRENCE DUE TO SURFACE RUNOFF OR SWELLING OF RIVER CHANNELS. PAGASA REGIONAL SERVICES DIVISIONS MAY ISSUE LOCAL THUNDERSTORM/RAINFALL ADVISORIES AND HEAVY RAINFALL WARNINGS WHILE THE HYDROMETEOROLOGY DIVISION AND RIVER BASIN FLOOD FORECASTING AND WARNING CENTERS MAY ISSUE GENERAL FLOOD ADVISORIES AND BASIN FLOOD BULLETINS AS APPROPRIATE.

SEVERE WIND: DUE TO THE LIKELIHOOD OF THIS WEATHER DISTURBANCE BECOMING A TROPICAL DEPRESSION, TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNAL #1 WILL BE HOISTED IN THE INITIAL SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN IN ANTICIPATION OF STRONG BREEZE TO NEAR GALE CONDITIONS.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

TOMORROW, MODERATE TO ROUGH SEAS (1.2 TO 2.8 M) MAY BE EXPERIENCED OVER THE EASTERN SEABOARD OF MINDANAO DUE TO THE APPROACHING TROPICAL DISTURBANCE. MARINERS OF SMALL SEACRAFTS ARE NOT ADVISED TO VENTURE OUT OVER THESE WATERS. INEXPERIENCED MARINERS OF THESE VESSELS SHOULD AVOID NAVIGATING IN THESE CONDITIONS.

THE PUBLIC AND DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICES CONCERNED ARE ADVISED TO TAKE APPROPRIATE MEASURES AND WATCH FOR THE NEXT UPDATE ON THIS WEATHER DISTURBANCE TO BE INCORPORATED IN THE 24-HOUR PUBLIC WEATHER FORECAST AT 4:00 AM TOMORROW.

UNLESS AN INTERMEDIATE ADVISORY OR INITIAL SEVERE WEATHER BULLETIN IS RELEASED, THE NEXT WEATHER ADVISORY WILL BE ISSUED AT 11:00 AM TOMORROW.
