Issued at 5:00 AM, 04 July 2025

THE LOW PRESSURE AREA WEST OF CALAYAN, CAGAYAN HAS DEVELOPED INTO TROPICAL DEPRESSION BISING.

Location of Center (4:00 AM)

The center of Tropical Depression BISING was estimated based on all available data at 200 km West Northwest of Calayan, Cagayan (19.7°N, 119.6°E).

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of 45 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 55 km/h, and central pressure of 1002 hPa

Present Movement

Southwestward at 20 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong winds extend outwards up to 200 km from the center

OTHER HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory issued No. 9 at 5:00 AM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Tropical Depression **BISING** and the Southwest Monsoon.

Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 3.0 m: The western seaboards of Babuyan Islands
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The western seaboard of Ilocos Norte, the northwestern seaboard of Ilocos Sur.
- Up to 2.0 m: The seaboard of Batanes, the western seaboards of La Union and Pangasinan, the remaining seaboard of Ilocos Sur.
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

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TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Tropical Depression BISING will continue moving generally westward slowly in the next 12 hours and may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility today. Afterwards, it will turn northeastward. Re-entry to the western boundary of the PAR is possible by Sunday (06 July). The forecast track is highly uncertain and a possible southward shift resulting to hoisting of Wind Signal No. 2 over Batanes and Babuyan Islands is not ruled out.
- BISING is forecast to intensify into a tropical storm by Saturday afternoon or evening and may further intensify as it moves
 over the sea south of Taiwan.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 11:00 AM today.
