### Tropical Depression EMONG (CO-MAY)

Issued at 5:00 AM, 26 July 2025

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 11:00 AM today.

#### “EMONG” WEAKENS INTO A TROPICAL DEPRESSION

##### Location of Center (4:00 AM)

The center of **Tropical Depression EMONG** was estimated based on all available data at **500 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (24.2°N, 125.0°E)**.

##### Intensity

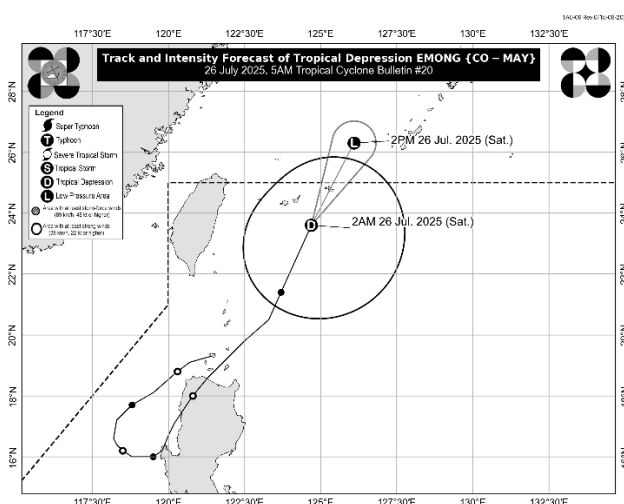
Maximum sustained winds of **55 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **70 km/h**, and central pressure of **996 hPa**.

##### Present Movement

**North northeastward at 45 km/h**

##### Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

**Strong winds** extend outwards up to **350 km** from the center

#### OTHER HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

##### Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to **Weather Advisory No. 43** issued at **5:00 AM today** for the heavy rainfall outlook due to EMONG and the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by EMONG.

##### Severe Winds

The enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring **strong to gale-force gusts** over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- **Today:** Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Northern Samar, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, and Davao Oriental
- **Tomorrow (27 July) and Monday (28 July):** Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Bulacan, Rizal, Quezon, Cavite, Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Palawan, Romblon, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Samar, Northern Samar, and Negros Occidental.



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#### HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

##### 24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Forecast wave heights are not related to storm surge heights.

##### **Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:**

- **Up to 4.0 m:** The seaboard of Batanes and Babuyan Islands; the northern seaboard of Ilocos Norte
- **Up to 3.0 m:** The seaboard of mainland Cagayan and Isabela; the western seaboard of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Pangasinan, and Zambales
- **Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.**

##### **Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:**

- **Up to 2.5 m:** The western seaboard of Bataan, Lubang Islands, Occidental Mindoro, Palawan including Calamian Islands, and Kalayaan Islands; the northeastern seaboard of Aurora
- **Up to 2.0 m:** The remaining seaboard of Bataan, Lubang Islands, Occidental Mindoro, Palawan, and Aurora; the northern and eastern seaboard of Polillo Islands, Camarines Norte, Catanduanes, and Northern Samar; the eastern seaboard of Sorsogon, Surigao del Sur, and Davao Oriental; the western seaboard of Batangas, Antique, and Guimaras; the southern seaboard of Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque and Quezon; the southwestern seaboard of Iloilo; the northern and western seaboard of Ticao Island and Romblon; the seaboard of Camarines Sur.
- **Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.**

#### TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

EMONG will continue to accelerate generally north northeastward and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility this morning. Due to increasing unfavorable environment and fast translational speed of EMONG, it will likely degenerate into a remnant low within the next 12 hours.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
