TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NR. 21F Tropical Depression EMONG (CO-MAY)

Issued at 11:00 AM, 26 July 2025

"EMONG" HAS EXITED THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY.

Location of Center (10:00 AM)

The center of **Tropical Depression EMONG** was estimated based on all available data at 695 km Northeast of Itbayat, Batanes (25.7°N, 126.0°E) (OUTSIDE PAR).

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **55 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **70 km/h**, and central pressure of **994 hPa**.

Present Movement

North northeastward at 35 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong winds extend outwards up to 350 km from the center

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 44 issued at 11:00 AM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Southwest Monsoon.

Severe Winds

The enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring **strong to gale-force gusts** over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today: Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Northern Samar, Western Visayas, Negros Occidental, and Davao Oriental
- Tomorrow (27 July) and Monday (28 July): Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Isabela, Nueva Vizcaya, Quirino, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Bulacan, Rizal, Quezon, Cavite, Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Palawan, Romblon, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Samar, Northern Samar, and Negros Occidental.

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HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Forecast wave heights are not related to storm surge heights.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m: The seaboards of Batanes and Babuyan Islands; the northern seaboard of Ilocos Norte
- Up to 3.0 m: The seaboards of mainland Cagayan and Isabela; the western seaboards of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Pangasinan, and Zambales
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The western seaboards of Bataan, Lubang Islands, Occidental Mindoro, Palawan including Calamian Islands, and Kalayaan Islands; the northeastern seaboard of Aurora
- Up to 2.0 m: The remaining seaboards of Bataan, Lubang Islands, Occidental Mindoro, Palawan, and Aurora; the northern and eastern seaboards of Polillo Islands, Camarines Norte, Catanduanes, and Northern Samar; the eastern seaboards of Sorsogon, Surigao del Sur, and Davao Oriental; the western seaboards of Batangas, Antique, and Guimaras; the southern seaboards of Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque and Quezon; the southwestern seaboard of Iloilo; the northern and western seaboards of Ticao Island and Romblon; the seaboards of Camarines Sur.
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

EMONG is forecast to weaken into a remnant low today while over the East China Sea.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

With this development and unless re-entry occurs, this is the final tropical cyclone bulletin. Succeeding updates will be incorporated in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast issued at 4:00 sssAM and 4:00 PM daily.
