**“JULIAN” MAINTAINS ITS STRENGTH AS IT STARTS TO RECURVE NORTH NORTHWESTWARD**

**Location of Center (4:00 PM)**

The center of the eye of Super Typhoon JULIAN was estimated based on all available data **245 km West of Itbayat, Batanes (21.0°N, 119.5°E)**

**Intensity**

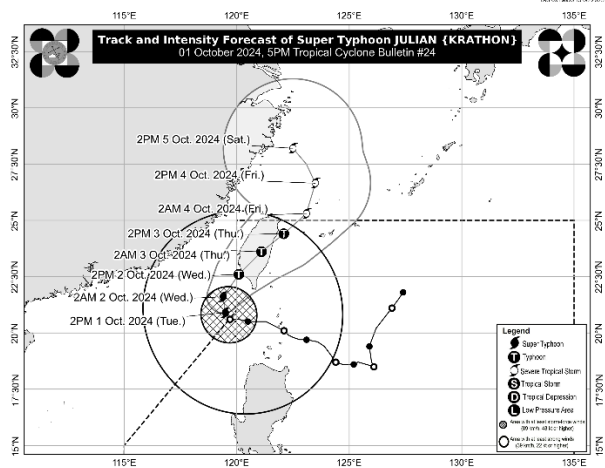
Maximum sustained winds of **195 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **240 km/h**, and central pressure of **915 hPa**

**Present Movement**

**North northwestward slowly**

**Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds**

**Strong to typhoon-force winds** extend outwards up to **560 km** from the center

OTHER HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS
<p><b>Heavy Rainfall Outlook</b></p> <p>Refer to Weather Advisory No. 24 issued at 5:00 PM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Super Typhoon JULIAN.</p> <p><b>Severe Winds</b></p> <p>The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are weaker in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Minimal to minor impacts</b> from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.</li> </ul> <p>Furthermore, the wind flow coming towards the circulation of JULIAN may also bring <b>strong to gale-force gusts</b> over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Today:</b> Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, the northern and eastern portions of mainland Cagayan, the eastern portion of Isabela, and Zambales</li> <li><b>Tomorrow (2 October):</b> Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, Abra, Apayao, Batanes, Babuyan Islands, the northern and eastern portions of mainland Cagayan, and the eastern portion of Isabela</li> <li><b>Thursday (3 October):</b> Batanes and Babuyan Islands</li> </ul>

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**HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS**

**A Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon.** For more information, refer to Gale Warning No. 10 issued at 5:00 PM today.

**24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook**

**Very rough seas** over the following coastal waters:

- **Up to 6.0 m** over the seaboard of Batanes,
- **Up to 4.5 m** over the seaboards of Babuyan Islands and Ilocos Norte

Sea travel is risky for most types or tonnage of vessels, including all small seacrafts and motorbancas. Mariners are advised to remain in port or seek safe shelter or harbor.

**Moderate or rough seas** over the following coastal waters:

- **Up to 4.0 m** over the seaboard of Ilocos Sur
- **Up to 3.0 m** over the remaining seaboards of Ilocos Region, and the seaboard of Mainland Cagayan
- **Up to 2.5 m** over the seaboard of Zambales, the seaboard of Isabela, and the seaboard of northern Aurora

Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels

**TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK**

- JULIAN is forecast to recurve towards the sea southwest of Taiwan today through tomorrow (2 October) morning. On the track forecast, this weather disturbance will make landfall along the southwestern coast of Taiwan tomorrow afternoon. It will then cross the rugged terrain of Taiwan before emerging over the sea east of Taiwan on Thursday (3 October) morning. Afterwards, JULIAN will move northeastward towards the East China Sea, and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility on Thursday evening or Friday (4 October) early morning, then turn northwestward on Friday evening to Saturday (5 October) early morning once over the East China Sea.
- JULIAN still has a window for brief intensification in the next 12 hours. Afterwards, increasing interaction with the mountainous terrain of Taiwan will slightly weaken JULIAN prior to making landfall. Its passage over Taiwan will result in JULIAN being downgraded into a severe tropical storm on Thursday afternoon or evening.
- **Due to weak steering, sudden change in the forecast track is likely.**

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
