TYPHOON "JENNY" CONTINUES TO MOVE AWAY FROM BATANES-SOUTHERN TAIWAN AREA

Location of Center (10:00 PM)	
The center of the eye of Typhoon JENNY was estimated based on all available data at 330 km West Northwest of Itbayat, Batanes (OUTSIDE PAR) (21.9°N, 118.9°E)

Maximum sustained winds of 130 km/h near the center, gustiness of up to 160 km/h , and central pressure of 970 hPa

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS
<p><u>Heavy Rainfall Outlook</u></p> <p>Typhoon JENNY is less likely to directly bring heavy rainfall over the country throughout the forecast period. Furthermore, the effect of the typhoon on the Southwest Monsoon has weakened, although the western section of Luzon may still experience some rainshowers. The public is advised to refer to the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast and Outlook issued at 4:00 PM today.</p>
<p><u>Severe Winds</u></p> <p>The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.</p> <p>Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.</p> <p>The weaker enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon by JENNY may still bring infrequent gusty conditions for the next 3 days over the western section of Luzon, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds.</p>

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS
<p>Under the influence of JENNY, a Gale Warning is in effect for the coastal waters along the northern and western seaboard of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning No. 9 issued at 5:00 PM today.</p>

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Outside the PAR region, JENNY will continue to move westward (becoming west southwestward to southwestward by Sunday) slowly over the coastal waters of southeastern China. JENNY is forecast to remain a typhoon until mid or late Saturday before entering a sustained weakening trend. The typhoon is forecast to become a remnant low on Tuesday.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
