

TROPICAL CYCLONE BULLETIN NR. 27

Typhoon MARCE (YINXING)

Issued at 11:00 AM, 08 November 2024 Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 PM today.

WIND SIGNAL NO.3 HAS BEEN LIFTED AS "MARCE" CONTINUES TO MOVE FURTHER AWAY FROM ILOCOS REGION.

Location of Center (10:00 AM)

The center of the eye of Typhoon MARCE was estimated based on all available data at 165 km West of Laoag City, llocos Norte or 165 km West of Batac, llocos Norte (18.3°N, 119.0°E)

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **140 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **170 km/h**, and central pressure of **965 hPa**

Present Movement

West southwestward at 20 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong to typhoon-force winds extend outwards up to 400 km from the center



OTHER HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Typhoon MARCE is less likely to bring heavy rainfall over the country in the next three days. With this development, a final Weather Advisory was issued at 11:00 AM.

Severe Winds

The wind signals warn the public of the general wind threat over an area due to the tropical cyclone. Local winds may be slightly stronger/enhanced in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds. Winds are less strong in areas sheltered from the prevailing wind direction.

- Minor to moderate impacts from gale-force winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 2.
- Minimal to minor impacts from strong winds are possible within any of the areas under Wind Signal No. 1.

Furthermore, the northeasterly wind flow and the periphery of MARCE will also bring **strong to gale-force gusts** over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

• Today (8 November): Batanes, northern Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, and Ilocos Region.

Coastal Inundation

There is a high risk of life-threatening storm surge with peak surge heights exceeding 3.0 m in the next 48 hours over the low-lying or exposed coastal localities of Babuyan Islands, llocos Norte, llocos Sur, and La Union. Refer to Storm Surge Warning No. 12 issued at 8:00 AM today for the details.

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HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern and western seaboards of Northern Luzon. For more information, refer to Gale Warning No.10A issued at 11:00 AM today.

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to very rough seas over the following coastal waters:

• Up to 4.5 m: The seaboards of llocos Region; the western seaboards of Batanes and Babuyan Islands

Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m: The seaboard of Zambales
- Up to 3.5 m: The remaining seaboards of Batanes and Babuyan Islands; the northern seaboard of mainland Cagayan.
- Up to 3.0 m: The remaining seaboard of mainland Cagayan, the seaboard of Isabela

Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The seaboard of northern Aurora; the western seaboards of Bataan, Lubang Islands, Calamian Islands, and mainland Palawan.
- Up to 2.0 m: The remaining seaboards of Aurora; the northern and eastern seaboards of Polillo Islands, Catanduanes, and Northern Samar; the seaboards of Camarines Norte; the northern seaboard of Camarines Sur; the eastern seaboards of Albay, Sorsogon, Eastern Samar, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Sur

Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- On the forecast track, MARCE will continue moving generally westward and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR)
 region this afternoon or evening. The surge of the northeasterly wind flow will result in a generally southwestward movement
 beginning on Sunday (10 November).
- MARCE is forecast to continue to weaken for the next days due to the possible dry air intrusion from the prevailing northeasterly wind flow. Nevertheless, it will remain as a typhoon throughout its passage within the PAR region.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all 4necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 PM today.
