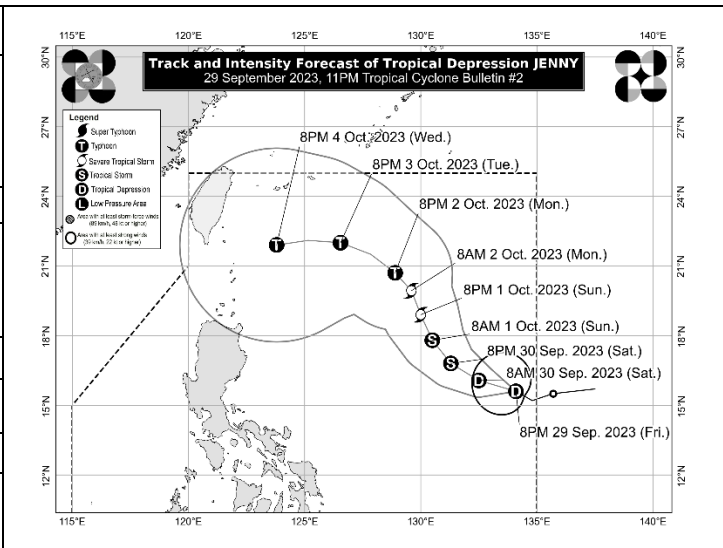
**Tropical Depression JENNY**

Issued at 11:00 PM, 29 September 2023

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 AM tomorrow.

**TROPICAL DEPRESSION "JENNY" SLIGHTLY DECELERATES WHILE MOVING WESTWARD.**

<b>Location of Center (10:00 PM)</b>
The center of Tropical Depression JENNY was estimated based on all available data at <b>1,050 km East Northeast of Southeastern Luzon</b> or <b>1,240 km East of Central Luzon (15.7°N, 133.7°E)</b>
<b>Intensity</b>
Maximum sustained winds of <b>55 km/h</b> near the center, gustiness of up to <b>70 km/h</b> , and central pressure of <b>1002 hPa</b>
<b>Present Movement</b>
<b>Westward at 15 km/h</b>
<b>Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds</b>
<b>Strong winds</b> extend outwards up to <b>220 km</b> from the center

**HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS**

**Heavy Rainfall Outlook**

Tropical Depression JENNY is not directly affecting the country at this time. However, due to the proximity of the track forecast to Extreme Northern Luzon, **heavy rainfall over Batanes and Babuyan Islands** may be experienced on Tuesday or Wednesday.

The Southwest Monsoon may be enhanced by this tropical cyclone, resulting in possible **occasional rains** over the western portions of Southern Luzon and Visayas on Sunday. As such, the possibility of issuing a Weather Advisory for Southwest Monsoon is not ruled out.

**Severe Winds**

The current forecast scenario shows that **Tropical Cyclone Wind Signals may be hoisted** over Extreme Northern Luzon on Sunday or Monday in anticipation of the onset of tropical cyclone severe winds. However, the hoisting may happen earlier should there be changes in the forecast scenario.

The potential enhancement of the Southwest Monsoon by JENNY will bring gusty conditions over the following areas not under any Wind Signal, especially in coastal and upland/mountainous areas exposed to winds:

- **Sunday:** Palawan, Romblon, most of Visayas, and Dinagat Islands
- **Monday:** Most of MIMAROPA and Visayas, and Dinagat Islands

**HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS**

**On Monday**, JENNY may bring moderate to rough seas (1.5 to 3.5 m) over the coastal waters of Extreme Northern Luzon and the northern mainland Cagayan. **Mariners of motor bancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.**

**TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK**

- JENNY is forecast to turn west northwestward tomorrow then northwestward or north northwestward on Sunday and Monday. A west northwestward turn towards Luzon Strait may take place on Tuesday. **A landfall or close approach scenario over Extreme Northern Luzon or northeastern mainland Cagayan is not ruled out since these scenarios are within the forecast confidence cone.**
- JENNY is forecast to steadily intensify throughout the forecast period and may become a tropical storm tomorrow afternoon or evening. Furthermore, this tropical cyclone may reach typhoon category on late Monday or on Tuesday.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**
