Tropical Storm DANTE (FRANCISCO)

Issued at 11:00 AM, 23 July 2025

Valid for broadcast until the next bulletin at 5:00 PM today.

“DANTE” INTENSIFIES INTO A TROPICAL STORM.

Location of Center (10:00 AM)

The center of **Tropical Storm DANTE** was estimated based on all available data at **900 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon (20.8°N, 130.6°E)**.

Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **65 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **80 km/h**, and central pressure of **996 hPa**.

Present Movement

North northwestward at 15 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong to gale-force winds extend outwards up to **350 km** from the center

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OTHER HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to **Weather Advisory No. 32 issued at 11:00 AM today** for the heavy rainfall outlook due to the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by DANTE and EMONG.

Severe Winds

The enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring **strong to gale-force gusts** over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- **Today:** Zambales, Bataan, Bulacan, Aurora, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, MIMAROPA, Visayas, Zamboanga del Norte, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Camiguin, Dinagat Islands, Davao Occidental, and Davao Oriental.
- **Tomorrow (24 July):** Central Luzon, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, MIMAROPA, Visayas, Zamboanga del Norte, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Camiguin, Davao Occidental, and Davao Oriental.
- **Friday (25 July):** Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Central Luzon, Metro Manila, Bicol Region, MIMAROPA, Visayas, Zamboanga del Norte, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Camiguin, Davao Occidental, and Davao Oriental.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- **Up to 3.5 m:** The western seaboard of Batanes, Babuyan Islands, Zambales, Bataan, and Lubang Island.
- **Up to 3.0 m:** The seaboard of Kalayaan Islands; the northern seaboard of Ilocos Norte; the western seaboard of Occidental Mindoro and Calamian Islands.
- **Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.**

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- **Up to 2.5 m:** The remaining seaboard of Babuyan Islands, Batanes, and Ilocos Region; the southern seaboard of Bataan; the western seaboard of Cavite, Batangas, and Palawan.
- **Up to 2.0 m:** The seaboard of Camarines Norte, Oriental Mindoro, Marinduque, and Romblon; the northern and eastern seaboard of Catanduanes and Northern Samar; the eastern seaboard of Albay, Sorsogon, Surigao del Sur, and Davao Oriental; the western seaboard of Masbate; the southern seaboard of Quezon; the remaining seaboard of Batangas, Occidental Mindoro, and Palawan; the northern seaboard of Camarines Sur.
- **Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.**

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK


- DANTE is forecast to move generally northwestward over the Philippine Sea for the next 24 hours and move towards the Ryukyu Islands and then East China Sea. On the track forecast, DANTE may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tomorrow (24 July) afternoon or evening.
- DANTE has reached Tropical Storm intensity at 8:00 AM today. Further intensification into a severe tropical storm remains less likely but is not ruled out.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 5:00 PM today.
