**Typhoon GORIO (PODUL)**

“GORIO” INTENSIFIES INTO A TYPHOON AS IT MOVES WESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA.	
Location of Center (4:00 AM)	
The center of Typhoon GORIO was estimated based on all available data at <b>745 km East of Itbayat, Batanes (20.7°N, 129.0°E).</b>	
Intensity	
Maximum sustained winds of <b>120 km/h</b> near the center, gustiness of up to <b>150 km/h</b> , and central pressure of <b>980 hPa</b>	
Present Movement	
Westward at 25 km/h	
Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds	
Strong to storm-force winds extend outwards up to <b>310 km</b> from the center

#### OTHER HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

##### Severe Winds

**GORIO's current track forecast shows a low chance of it directly affecting the country within the next three days.**

However, in the event of a further southward shift in the forecast track, hoisting of Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal over Extreme Northern Luzon is not ruled out.

#### HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

##### 24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

**Up to very rough seas over the following coastal waters:**

- **Up to 5.5 m:** The seaboards of Batanes
- **Sea travel is risky all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.**

**Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:**

- **Up to 3.5 m:** The northern and eastern seaboards of Babuyan Islands
- **Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.**

**Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:**

- **Up to 2.5 m:** The remaining seaboards of Babuyan Islands; the northeastern seaboard of mainland Cagayan
- **Up to 2.0 m:** The remaining seaboards of mainland Cagayan; the seaboard of Isabela; the northeastern seaboard of Aurora
- **Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.**

#### TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- GORIO is forecast to move west northwestward for the entirety of the forecast period. On the track forecast, GORIO may make landfall over the eastern coast of Taiwan tomorrow (13 August) afternoon and exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) by tomorrow evening.
- GORIO has intensified into a typhoon and is forecast to maintain its strength prior to its landfall to Taiwan before weakening throughout the remainder of the forecast period.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

The next tropical cyclone bulletin will be issued at 11:00 AM today.
