**TROPICAL DEPRESSION "GENER" IS NOW OUTSIDE THE PHILIPPINE AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY**

**Location of Center (4:00 AM)**

The center of Tropical Depression GENER was estimated based on all available data at **410 km West of Bacnotan, La Union (17.4°N, 116.6°E)**

**Intensity**

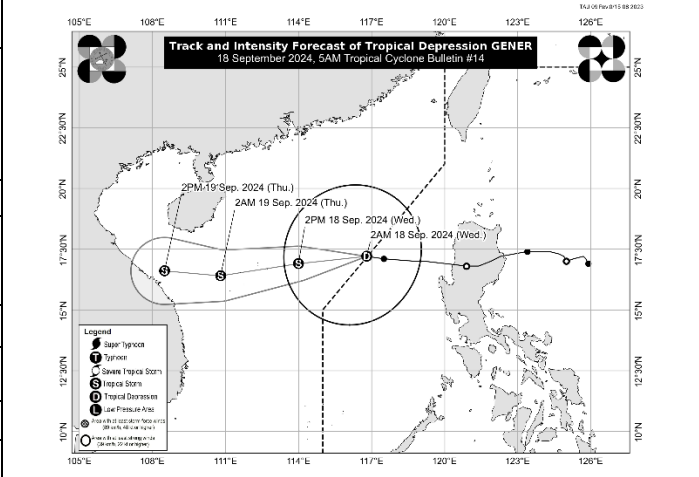
Maximum sustained winds of **55 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **70 km/h**, and central pressure of **996 hPa**

**Present Movement**

**Westward at 15 km/h**

**Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds**

**Strong winds** extend outwards up to **360 km** from the center

#### OTHER HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 31 issued at 5:00 AM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by GENER and HELEN.

##### Severe Winds

The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by GENER and HELEN will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- **Today:** Zambales, Bataan, Pampanga, Bulacan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, Northern Mindanao, Caraga, and Davao Region
- **Tomorrow (19 September):** Ilocos Region, Isabela, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Metro Manila, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Western Visayas, Negros Island Region, and Zamboanga Peninsula
- **Thursday (20 September):** Ilocos Region, Isabela, Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Quezon, Occidental Mindoro, Marinduque, and Romblon

#### HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

##### 24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

**Gale Warning is in effect** over several coastal waters in the western seaboard of Central Luzon, Southern Luzon, and Visayas. For more information, refer to Gale Warning No. 8 issued at 5:00 AM today. **Sea travel in these waters is risky for small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas.**

**Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters outside Gale Warning areas:**

- **1.0 to 3.5 m:** The northern seaboards of Cagayan Valley and Zamboanga Peninsula, the seaboards of Caraga and Ilocos Region; the eastern seaboards of Bicol Region, Davao Region, and Eastern Visayas; the western and southern seaboards of CALABARZON and Negros Island Region.
- **Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.**

**Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters outside Gale Warning areas:**

- **Up to 2.5 m:** The remaining seaboards of the country.
- **Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions.**

#### TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

- Outside the PAR region, GENER will continue to move westward over the West Philippine Sea and is heading towards Vietnam.
- GENER is forecast to have limited intensification within the forecast period, although it may reach tropical storm category by today.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. **For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.**

Unless re-entry occurs, **this is the final tropical cyclone bulletin.** Further updates will be provided in the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast to be issued at 4:00 AM and 4:00 PM daily.
