SPECIAL WEATHER OUTLOOK ON THE OPENING OF CLASSES
(Monday, 04 June 2018)

The latest analysis shows that the combined effects of the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) and the low pressure area (LPA) over West Philippine Sea will bring cloudy skies with occasional rainshowers and thunderstorms over Palawan, Visayas and Mindanao today. Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon will experience warm and humid conditions apart from some isolated rainshowers and thunderstorms in the afternoon or evening.

Tomorrow (June 2) until Monday (June 4), occasional moderate to heavy rains will persist over Palawan, Mindoro and the western sections of Visayas and Mindanao. The rest of Visayas and Mindanao will have light to moderate rains, while Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon will continue to have warm and humid weather condition apart from some isolated rainshowers and thunderstorms in the afternoon or evening.

Meanwhile, embedded in the ITCZ are two (2) low pressure areas (LPA) located east and west of the country. Both LPAs may develop into tropical cyclones (TC) around this weekend or early next week, which could trigger the onset of the rainy season.

The coastal waters of the entire archipelago, during the outlook period, will be slight to moderate to at times rough especially during thunderstorms.

This weather outlook will be updated as soon as significant changes in the weather occur.
