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GENERAL OUTLOOK FOR THE FORECAST PERIOD

- The tropical depression is forecast to turn west northwestward and northwestward over the next two days and may enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on Wednesday. Once inside the PAR, the domestic name "ODETTE" will be assigned to this tropical cyclone. Its duration within the PAR region is currently forecast to be short, as it may leave the region within 24 hours of entry. However, the public is advised to continue monitoring for possible eastward or westward shift in the track forecast of the depression.
- The tropical depression is forecast to gradually intensify and may reach tropical storm category within two days.
- This tropical cyclone is less likely to affect the prevailing weather condition in the country for the next 3 to 5 days.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to continue monitoring for updates related to this tropical cyclone.

Unless an intermediate advisory or initial tropical cyclone bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 AM tomorrow.
