TROPICAL STORM "HAIKUI" SLIGHTLY INTENSIFIES AS IT MOVES WEST NORTHWESTWARD OVER THE PHILIPPINE SEA

Location of Center (10:00 AM)

The center of Tropical Storm HAIKUI was estimated based on all available data at **1,660 km East of Extreme Northern Luzon (OUTSIDE PAR) (18.8°N, 137.7°E)**

Intensity

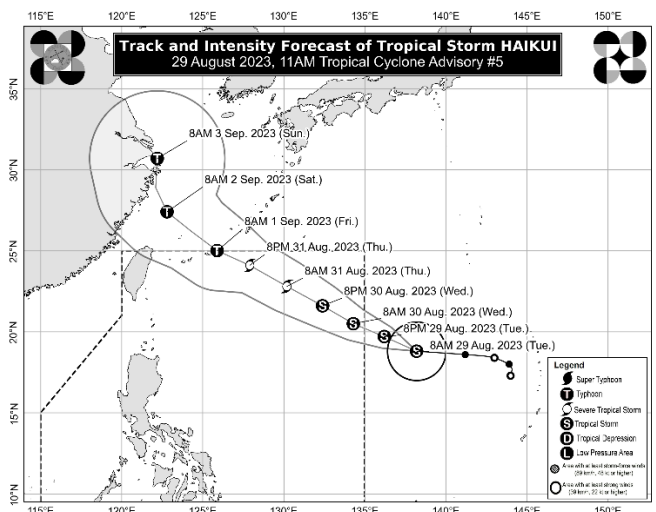
Maximum sustained winds of **75 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **90 km/h**, and central pressure of **996 hPa**

Present Movement

West Northwestward at 20 km/h

Extent of Tropical Cyclone Winds

Strong to gale-force winds extend outwards up to **200 km** from the center

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GENERAL OUTLOOK FOR THE FORECAST PERIOD

- HAIKUI is forecast to move generally west northwestward over the Philippine Sea and may enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) tomorrow morning. Once inside the PAR, the domestic name "HANNA" will be assigned to this tropical cyclone. On the forecast track, the storm is forecast to remain far from the Philippine landmass and may exit the PAR on Friday while approaching the Ryukyu Islands. Outside the PAR region, HAIKUI will turn northwestward or northward over the East China Sea.
- HAIKUI is forecast to continuously intensify within the next 5 days. It is forecast to become a typhoon within the PAR region and may reach its peak intensity on Friday evening as it moves outside PAR.
- The current forecast scenario suggests that HAIKUI is less likely to directly affect the country. However, it may enhance the Southwest Monsoon beginning tomorrow or Thursday. This may result in the continuation of occasional or monsoon rains over the western portion of Luzon and Visayas throughout this week.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to continue monitoring for updates related to this tropical cyclone.

Unless an intermediate advisory or initial tropical cyclone bulletin is released, the next tropical cyclone advisory will be issued at 11:00 PM today.
